Festivals and Competitions Round Up

The Active Schools Team was delighted to see the return of its calendar of events this term. It has been such a long time coming, but we couldn't be happier to be welcoming pupils back to the court!

Thursday 11 November saw the return of our first event in 19 months – Small Schools Netball! Twelve teams from across the Borders came together to play it out for the 2021 title. Denholm met Newtown in the Final, having beaten Glendinning and Gordon in the semi-finals respectively. It was to be Denholm's day as they came out victorious with a 3-0 win. What a day! Pupils brought nothing but enthusiasm and determination with them and



it was obvious to see that we weren't the only ones excited to be back!



In November we welcomed the return of Sportshall Athletics! With a slightly different format to normal, four sessions over two days saw heats between Gala/Selkirk primaries and Earlston/ Kelso primaries take place, with St Peter's and Knowepark and Melrose and Lauder, making it through to the Finals from their respective area competitions. Joining them in the January 2022 Finals will be Priorsford and Kingsland from Peebles. It was great to see the children taking part in another competitive event but at the same time, having lots of fun!

Our events wouldn't be possible without the help of school staff, PE teachers, parent volunteers and college students, who help prepare pupils for the event and also assist with the umpiring and officiating on the day itself. Huge thank you goes to everyone who gets involved, no matter how small the contribution!

Extra-curricular round op With the return of our calendar of events, we have also seen an increase in our extra-curricular offerings this term. No fewer than 146 primary and 116 secondary clubs have been running before school, at lunchtimes and after school, as teams prepare to get back on the court and pitch. Friday afternoon and weekend hockey and rugby fixtures have also made a welcome return in secondary schools. We finally got the go-ahead to recruit new volunteers in to our workforce and in the new year are very much looking forward to linking with Borders College, assisting students with sports placements in our primary and secondary schools.



School-Club Links



We have continued to build links (52 to be precise!) between schools and community clubs this term. These links help create continuity between school and community sport and enable pupils to further their enjoyment, skills and experience by continuing to participate in their local community. Partnerships like this are vital for our participation pathway and our quest to making our young people active lifelong.

For many children, making the transition directly from school to a community club can be a daunting prospect, therefore one of our key priorities is to increase the quality and quantity of extra-curricular sport available to school pupils, whilst ensuring that the transition to community clubs is easily accessible.

So what are the benefits of making school-club links with Active Schools? Clubs get direct liaison with cluster schools; increased profile and awareness of the club in the local community; potential for increased club membership and young volunteers and leaders assisting with the club. 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The Team has been involved with the delivery of no fewer than 15 g primary school this term. The group has made a fantastic start and has done a tremendous job leading a block of tennis to an S1-3 group from pupil support. Next term they will continue improving their delivery skills and also organise and deliver their own sports festival.
