That's it - another term that has gone by in a flash, as we roll in to our 2024 Easter holidays! It has been a fast, furious and, as always, fun, couple of months! The Active Schools team has been non-stop from the word 'go' in January and is very much looking forward to a couple of weeks rest before we enter the final term of the year! As always, our newsletter will focus on the monthly SportScotland themes of the past three months; this time including: Being Active, Try Something New and Women and Girls in Sport. No fewer than 17 festivals and events have taken place this term, with over 2300 P5-7 pupils attending! After finishing 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> respectively at the Borders Sportshall Athletics Final, Priorsford and Kingsland Primary Schools progressed through to the East of Scotland Final at Meadowbank Sports Centre in February. The East Final brought together finalists from Edinburgh, West Lothian, Midlothian and the Borders, to compete over a series of indoor track and field events. Following a very exciting morning and fantastic team performances, Priorsford were crowned East of Scotland Champions for the second year in a row, with Kingsland finishing a fantastic fourth!



February saw the return of our Small Schools Basketball Competition, with 15 teams from across the Borders taking to the court. Teams played across three pools, with the pool winners going on to play a round robin final. Congratulations to our top three teams: Stow (1), Balmoral (2) and Yetholm (3). It was a fantastic day full of end-to-end play, amazing skills and a buzzing atmosphere!

February was a busy month, which also saw primary cross-country events taking place in four clusters. Rounding off our term two events were Area Basketball and Border Finals. The top team from each area competition made their way to Gala on 21 March to fight it out for the 2024 title. Knowepark, Broomlands, Eyemouth, Newtown, Drumlanrig, Newlands and Balmoral battled it out in a round robin competition. Our 2024 Champions are Drumlanrig!

**Borders College Partnership Working** Active Schools has been working in partnership with Borders College, providing placements for level seven and eight students. Ten level seven mountain bike students ran 8-week blocks of mountain biking skills sessions in three Tweeddale primary schools, which saw 66 P4-7 pupils attending. The bikers have enjoyed passing on their knowledge, with children picking up tips on cornering, wheel lifts, bunny hops and track stands! To round





off the coaching block, the level eight students organised a biking a second state of the festival for those who have been part of the programme. This brought pupils together for a fun afternoon of activity stations and mini races - it was fantastic to see everyone putting their newly learnt skills into practice!

> Meanwhile, four level eight students delivered a 5-week after school golf club to primary five pupils at Melrose PS, as part of their Sports Development unit. 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### Just Cycle Short Track Racing

Earlston Active Schools has been working alongside the Scottish Borders Cycle Speedway Development Group and Live Borders Sports Development Team to pilot a Short Track Bike Competition. Over this term and next, all P4-7 pupils in the eight cluster primary schools, will have the opportunity to take part in a 4-week short track racing block at school. Following the taster sessions, pupils will be invited to take part in the first ever inter-school competition in June, kindly sponsored by Just Cycle of Tweedbank. Keen pupils will also have the chance to join the Border Raiders coaching sessions and compete in the Scottish Speedway League and other cycle speedway competitions. February saw 260 P5-7 pupils from all 10 Berwickshire primary schools attend their Cross-Country Championships in Eyemouth.
